For us, one of the highlights of this year was being asked to speak at the first-ever TEDxTotnes.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2015-2016

Community

- Facilitated 12 social groups in South Devon, with an average of 30 people attending each month
- Hosted Totnes Pride 2015, attended by approximately 1350 people with the largest Totnes
 Pride procession to date
- Held a rainbow flag raising ceremony to launch Totnes Pride 2015, a first for Totnes

Youth

- Facilitated 15 youth group sessions, with 23 young people aged 13-19 supported from Totnes and surrounding areas and an average of 8 young people attending each session
- Delivered 3 1:1 mentoring sessions with students in schools in South Devon

 Devon Youth Service

Campaigning

- Continued campaigning to install a permanent rainbow pedestrian crossing in Totnes. If approved, this will be the first of its kind in Europe.

- Consultants produced a draft design of the rainbow crossing.
- In the reporting year, the campaign received 57 pledges of support, locally, nationally and internationally.

The above results reflect our not for profit ethic whilst allowing for a small increase to reserves in order to maintain and improve our capacity to provide services to our beneficiaries.

Of the income received in the year, £6,652 is grants from organisations (2015 £4,085). If grants are unspent they are technically due back to the donor and so these are shown in the balance sheet as deferred income and are included here within creditors. The amounts included within creditors for the year are £12,193 (2015 £3,806).

LOOKING AHEAD

Community

We will host the fourth Totnes Pride, with the aim of securing funding that will mean that we no longer need to charge entry at the Day Event, making it more even more inclusive and accessible.

We will continue delivering our monthly adult social group in South Devon. Our focus will be to secure funding to enable us to offer this service free of charge, making it more inclusive and even more accessible.

We will continue delivering our family friendly craft days in South Devon. Our focus will be to find a larger and more accessible venue to better suit the needs of attendees.

Youth

We will work to increase the participation levels of young people by involving them more regularly in the planning and evaluation of the group.

We will also work to connect the voice of LGBTQIA+ young people, ensuring that they have a chance to influence young people's services in Devon.

Training

We will deliver more LGBT+ awareness workshops in schools and colleges in Devon and Cornwall, with the aim of reaching approximately 1000 students in the reporting year.

Media

We will support LGBTQIA+ young people in developing new ways to communicate their ideas, opinions and stories safely via various means of social media.

Campaigning

We will establish an action group to help finish the final version of the proposal to gain approval from Devon County Council to install Europe's first permanent rainbow crossing in Totnes, South Devon.

Volunteering

We will continue to provide a wide range of volunteering opportunities and develop our volunteer package to enable volunteers to access even more in-house and external training.
